# Keystone Exams

- IT IS ABOUT COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS
- Are students in Pennsylvania ready to be competitive in today's world and the future?

Requires proficiency for graduation on Keystone Exam:

- Graduation Class of 2018: Algebra I, Biology, Literature, and possibly more depending on state funding
- Project option for those who are not proficient by the end of the junior year

# Scheduling Process

- Course Selection Sheet
- Student/Parent initiated counselor meeting
- Turn in to Mrs. Miller by January 17th
- Scheduling Portal closes January 17th
- Course verification forms
- Schedule changes May 28th from 4:30 until 6:30 (Must have parent/guardian signature on request form)

# Scheduling Process

- ✓ Scheduling selections in MMS Portal by January 17th
- ✓ Completed Course Selection Sheets to Mrs. Miller by January 17th
- ✓ Course verifications mailed February 6<sup>th</sup>; Changes due in the guidance office by February 13<sup>th</sup>
- ✓ Course recommendations mailed March 4th  
Recommendation override requests due to NOHS guidance office by March 13<sup>th</sup>
- ✓ Tentative 2014/2015 schedules mailed May 12<sup>th</sup>
- ✓ Schedule changes for incoming freshmen May 28  
High School Guidance 4:30 – 6:30

# Choosing Classes

- Must choose 8 each year (except possibly the senior year).
- Must pass at least 7 credits per year.
- Each class passed earns 1 credit.
- May not choose teachers.
- May not choose classes to be with friends.
- Appropriate changes will be allowed during the designated time.

# Class Levels

- Level 1 – Best for students planning on entering the workforce after graduation or attending a trade or technical school. (Students advanced or proficient may not take Level 1 in core subjects.)
- Level 2 – Best for students planning on attending a college or a trade and technical school.
- Level 3 – Best for students who show exceptional talent in a subject area (considered honors courses).
- Levels do impact weighted grade point average or GPA.

# Choosing Class Levels

- Keep in mind your career goals.
- Teachers will make recommendations based upon this year's performance.
- Parents disagreeing with teacher recommendations must submit it in writing.
- Students may mix course levels depending on areas of strength.
- Students who are proficient or advanced on the PSSA's and 4Sight's or in Reading may only schedule for level 2 English and social studies.

Course Description for course 5141 3-D Art I Lv1

This course will introduce students to the materials and methods used to produce various types of three-dimensional arts. A brief history of each type of art will be included in instruction. Projects will be planned and presented by the teacher.
